Dear parents and carers,

This week, we were blessed with a visit from Pete Bergin who came to talk to the children on the Feast Day of our Lady. He came to tell them about a young girl called Bernadette Soubirous (St Bernadette). On February 25, 1858, the Virgin Mary appeared to Bernadette in the grotto at Lourdes, France. The Virgin Mary told Bernadette to drink from the spring that flowed under a rock. Bernadette dug in the ground, but found no water . A day or so later, water started to flow from the ground. The puddle became a pool, and then a sacred spring. People who were sick or dying washed in the water and were cured. The Catholic Church approved the apparitions for devotion in 1862. A shrine was built at the site, which is now a popular pilgrimage destination.

Peter Bergin is a teacher but he is also a volunteer for the Lourdes Pilgrimage Appeal. Every year members of our parish and local community visit the sacred shrine with the sick along with many young people from our diocese who want to help. The appeal collects money to subsidise the trip so that as many young people can go as possible. Pete also came to say thank to the children and to all our families who have supported this charity through our Advent and Christmas performances and through our church.

In this jubilee year of hope there will be many more opportunities to reach out to those in need and we will be looking forward to another fundraiser over the Easter period. I hope that, as always you always do, you will be able to give generously.

Enjoy this week's newsletter and have a very blessed and happy half term break. God bless one and all!




This week's spelling rule: If a word ends in a short vowel + consonant, double the consonant before adding the suffix -ed. Example: $clap \rightarrow clapped$

Red words (RECAP): friend, said, saw, want, water, watch.




Year 3 – Saint Veronica
